# GIVING OPTIONS

There are a variety of ways to give not each one fits everyone. INCOME-BASED GIVING

Priority Budgeting: One approach to giving is by rearranging priorities during the campaign. This might be achieved by postponing a planned expenditure or by sharing a portion of a salary increase or bonus as part of your gift.

Another possible approach is through various types of investments that distribute interest or dividends. If the donor is not using the distribution for current income, rather than to be reinvested, the interest or dividends may be assigned, for a defined period, to the campaign. The donor retains ownership of the asset.

SSET-BASED GIVING

**Appreciated Assets:** A gift of investment assets which have appreciated in value is one of the most common aifting strategies.

Stocks and Bonds: Funding charitable giving with appreciated stocks or bonds can be very advantageou to both he donor and the church. The donor will avoid paying any capital gains taxes while receiving a full value charitable deduction, and the church will receive a very liquid asset. To claim all these benefits, the stocks/bonds must be transferred to the church rather than selling them and donating the proceeds, which then turns the gift into an ordinary cash gift.

**Life Insurance:** Some people have accumulated cash in insurance policies which they then give to the church. Others purchase new policies with the church as beneficiary or name the church beneficiary of an existing policy. Donors may also give the entire policy as an outright gift.

**IRA Rollover.** It is possible to make a gift directly from an IRA. Donors who are 70 1/2 years or older may roll over gifts up to \$100,000/year directly from their IRA to the church. This rollover will count toward their Required Minimum Distribution, will not be taxable income, but will also not be allowed as a charitable deduction for those who itemize their deductions. Donors should contact their IRA administrator to direct their rollover gift to the church.

Tax advantages should never be assumed. The various gifting strategies have certain tax implications which may or may not affect a specific donor's personal income liability. For expert assistance, consult a tax attorney or tax accountant.

# **GIVING TIERS**OVER 3 YEARS

Your gift is based on your capacity to give.

Most people give a monthly gift over the three year campaign.

The vision for this campaign is in response to First Lutheran's desire to continue to grow our ministry and all that God is doing through our church. By eliminating our long-term debt, we can effectively continue to grow and expand our ministry to the congregation and to the community.

#### WHAT IS OUR FINANCIAL GOAL FOR THIS CAPITAL CAMPAIGN?

The goal is to pay off our debt in the amount of \$2.9 million in three years. Based on our last campaign, which raised \$4.1 million, and by each one of us giving our best gift, this is an achievable goal.

#### WHAT WAS THE COST OF CONSTRUCTION OF OUR NEW BUILDING?

The total project cost was \$9.7 million.

#### WHEN WILL THE NEW SANCTUARY BE BUILT?

After the Beyond the Building campaign is complete in 2024, our financial capabilities will be assessed and we will begin to discern as a congregation both the timetable and our financial ability to proceed with the construction phase of a new sanctuary.

### WHAT IS THE SOURCE OF OUR MONTHLY PAYMENTS FOR OUR CURRENT MORTGAGE?

Our monthly mortgage payments of \$25,010 will be made through the support of the Beyond the Building Campaign and are not part of the annual operating budget. The previous campaign, From the Ground Up, ended in 2020. We still owe \$2.9 million on our mortgage. This is the debt that we are addressing in the Beyond the Building campaign.

In 2020, we increased our budget by 11%, which is a significant but needed increase. We acknowledge that it is a step of faith for us to both increase our annual stewardship



and accomplish a capital campaign. With that being said, our priority is always to support our day-to-day mission and ministry. We firmly believe we can accomplish both. First Lutheran has always been and continues to be faithful and engaged stewards.

#### WHAT IS OUR INTEREST RATE ON THE LOAN?

Our current loan is through the Mission Investment Fund of the ELCA, and our current interest rate is 4.0%.

### WHAT ARE SOME OF THE SIGNS OF GROWTH THAT HAVE HAPPENED IN RECENT YEARS AT FIRST LUTHERAN?

We have been averaging 700 more worshippers per month since our relocation. Children and Youth Ministries have both seen continuous growth on a monthly basis. Community Preschool has significantly grown in attendance in the 2019–20 school year with approximately 125 slots filled, as opposed to 83 at our old location. New member numbers also continue to rise with 138 people joining in 2020.

#### WHY SHOULD I GIVE?

We are thankful for God's faithfulness and invite you to support First Lutheran Church and this campaign with your prayers, your energy, and your financial resources. Our mutual support and the thoughtful giving of members will enable us to move boldly into the future. We are filled with excitement for what is ahead. Our campaign will not include pressure tactics, nor should your gift be given out of obligation. Our theme verse (2 Corinthians 9:7) reminds us of the joy that we receive in living generously. It is our prayer that each one of us will be blessed and encouraged in our faith as we respond to this campaign.

#### HOW DO I DECIDE HOW MUCH TO GIVE?

There is no exact formula. Only you and God know the answer to how much you should give. Invite God into the process and ask God to guide you in making your pledge. More than anything else, it is hoped you discover the joy and freedom of giving your best gift in this campaign.
