abundance of TIME

Which one of you, having one hundred sheep and losing one of them, does not leave the ninetynine in the wilderness and go after the one that is lost until he finds it?

-Luke 15:4

apundance of TREASURE

They are to do good, to be rich in good works, generous, and ready to share.

-1 Timothy 6:18
